

# SERMON TOPIC: Signs On The Highway To Hell

## SERMON SUMMARY

This week's sermon focused on the concept of two eternal destinations: Babylon and Jerusalem, representing hell and heaven, respectively. Pastor Clark emphasized that many people believe they are on the path to heaven by their own efforts, but in reality, they might be on the highway to hell. The sermon highlighted the importance of seeking God's way rather than relying on human pride and efforts. It also discussed the biblical story of the Tower of Babel as an example of human pride and the futility of trying to reach God through human means. Pastor Clark urged the congregation to examine their lives and ensure they are living for God's glory and not their own comfort or fame.

1. Human efforts cannot lead us to God; only through Jesus can we find the way to heaven.
2. Pride and self-reliance are signs of being on the wrong path.
3. Babylon represents a system of living without God, which is prevalent in today's world.
4. We must choose to live for God's glory and not our own fame or comfort.
5. God's grace is the only way to salvation, and it requires us to humble ourselves before Him.
